

Tokyo's 2,001-Foot Tower Will Be Tallest Freestanding Antenna

It doesn't have a name yet, but when it's completed in 2011, the 2,001-foot-tall concrete-and-steel tower in the Sumida River region of Tokyo will be the tallest free-standing antenna in the world. Ostensibly, its purpose is to host all of the city's digital radio and television signals, plus a mobile TV network. But the massive transmitter will also broadcast Japan's global cultural significance. It's no coincidence that the new structure resembles the old 1,092-foot-high Tokyo Tower, which for 50 years stood as a symbol of the nation's postwar economic independence. Project organizers hope that the superspike — designed with the help of sculptor Kiichi Sumikawa and architect Tadao Ando — will reaffirm Japan's prowess. Because it will dominate the relatively low-rise landscape, the point will be hard to miss.

DirecTV Announces Plan to Provide Service via BPL

According to the August 15 edition of *The Wall Street Journal*, "Satellite-television provider DirecTV announced a wholesale agreement today with <u>Current Group</u> to provide high-speed Internet service over electric-power lines," otherwise known as broadband over powerlines (BPL). "Broadband over power line is a new technology that allows customers to plug a modem device the size of a cell phone into an electric outlet and connect a cable from their computer for Internet access that is capable of speeds that are faster than some popular Internet plans from cable and phone companies. Current is building out broadband networks in Cincinnati and Dallas-Fort Worth and is in talks with a number of utilities around the world

about a commercial rollout," the Journal said. ARRL CEO David Sumner, K1ZZ, said "There is no reason to panic [over this decision]. ARRL's only concern about BPL is the interference potential. In that regard, the approach that Current has taken to date -- limiting its use of the medium-voltage lines to 30-50 MHz and using the HomePlug standard to avoid the HF ham bands on the low-voltage drop -- has been satisfactory. If the FCC mandated what Current has been doing, we would be quite happy." Sumner continued: "We can be glad that DirecTV chose to align itself with a BPL company that has taken the interference problem seriously and has a good track record of avoiding interference in the amateur bands."

ARRL Laboratory Manager Ed Hare W1RFI commented, "ARRL and Current have communicated regularly over the past few years. Current has been an early leader in carefully choosing its design to avoid interference to Amateur Radio. They don't operate below 30 MHz on overhead lines at all, and use HomePlug technology, which doesn't use the ham bands, in customers' premises. To date, ARRL has no Amateur Radio interference reports involving Current or HomePlug equipment." (ARRL Webpage news release, 8-16-07)

All,

Let's not allow the announcement about Direct TV via BPL get out of proportion. Obviously, neither I nor the rest of the ARRL Board are far from enamored with certain forms of BPL; however, let us keep any objection rational. There is no basis in fact to object to all forms of BPL. Our mobjection and the ARRL fight over BPL is specifically limited to interference some improperly-engineered and operated BPL systems produce on Amateur Radio and public service frequencies.

Where there is no interference, we have basis to object. To keep the record straight, ARRL does not object to BPL as such. It objects to and is fighting hard against interference caused by interference-causing BPL systems. Finally, we have taken the FCC to Federal Court over recent rules for BPL that give QRMing non-broadcast (part 15) BPL providers advantage over licensed public safety, etc and amateur operations. Regarding the Direct TV effort, it is significant that the agreement they entered is with Current Technology. Current is the system CG&E (now Duke) operates. There has been no indication through the past years that this system causes interference here or elsewhere. A number of people around here are keeping a close "ear" on the locall system as part of an ongoing effort Section Manager Joe Phillips,K8QOE initiated. What is different about the Direct TV/Current Technologies BPL proposal? It merely puts two, clean, successful systems together in what can be expected to be an uneventful "marriage." Direct TV does not cause QRM to our or public service frequencies. Current Technologies BPL similarly does not cause interference to these same frequencies. Linking a non-interfering satellite TV system with a non-interfering BPL system should be the same as adding 0 to 0 to equal 0.

Even so, we should remain on our toes to see if anything happens when (or if) Current begins to carry Direct TV.

Please do not go off on witch hunts where witches don't exist. Complaining about systems that do not cause problems is a sure way for us to lose credibility for times when interference actually exists and we need to complain.
