FCC Cell phone backup proposal and ARES posted Mon, Mar 10, recommended by Bruce N8BV Dear Fellow PIOs:

The Associated Press ran the story below last Friday (March 7, 2008). I don't see any action that needs to be taken now with this, but the story is definitely worth watching as to future impact on ARES operations and how ham radio operators respond in a widespread disaster.

As a result of Hurricane Katrina, the FCC is ruling that all 210,000 cell phone towers in the nation be equipped with 8 hours of back-up capability.

The cell phone industry is rebelling from a cost standpoint. A cell phone executive is quoted as saying that in metropolitan areas where cell traffic can be heavy during and after a disaster, the amount of batteries needed to sustain 8 hours of talk time would equate to 1,500 lbs. Since so many cell repeaters are located on roof tops, most roof top installations can't sustain that much weight.

Feel free to use a search engine to research more on this topic. As of this morning there were 246 related articles on Google News since last Friday's original AP story, an excerpt of which is shown below. Please share this information with your club and local ARES organization. The information clearly shows the superiority of amateur radio following a widespread disaster. Cell Carriers Fight Backup Power Rule

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) - When Hurricane Katrina assaulted the Gulf Coast in 2005, wind and flooding knocked out hundreds of cell towers and cell sites, silencing wireless communication exactly when emergency crews and victims needed it.

To avoid similar debacles in the future, the Federal Communications Commission wants most cell transmitter sites in the U.S. to have at least eight hours of backup power in the event main power fails, one of several moves regulators say will make the nation's communication system stronger and more reliable.

[Dial] Buying a new digital TV converter box

The digital TV transition (DTV) is now 11 months away. If you use an antenna or rabbit ears to receive TV, you may need these new digital TV converter boxes. If you have a new TV that says that it has an ATSC or DTV tuner, you won't need a converter box. If you have use of only cable or satellite, you don't need a converter box. But if you have a bunch of old TVs sitting around that don't have a new ATSC or DTV tuner, you will need a DTV converter.

If you haven't applied for your free \$40 government coupons, go here and do it right away - http://www.dtv2009.gov/ The NTIA (federal government) is giving away two \$40 coupons to each household to help you purchase one of these DTV converters.

These new DTV converter boxes have finally hit the store shelves. You can use them now, as the local TV stations are broadcasting in both the old standard analog format as well as the new fully digital format (with crystal clear pictures). Now, which box to buy?????

I've been reading reviews on the available Digital TV converter boxes that can be purchased with your government coupon. (My coupon is expected in the next few weeks according to their website.) Once you get a \$40 coupon, you will want to know which box to purchase, so below are some details. But the short answer is to get the Zenith at HH Gregg. That one will cost you \$10 + the coupon + tax.

So far the boxes that are at the top of the recommended list include these two below. They both have remotes that

allow you to program them to control your TV volume. They both have buttons on the box that allow you to change channels without a remote. They both have the ability to manually add new stations without doing a full scan. They both are reported to have the latest generation ATSC/DTV chips that pull in the signals better than what has been on the market. They have electronic program guides and lots of other features.

Zenith DTT 900, Manufactured by LG. It is sold at HH Gregg for \$49, Circuit City for \$59.

Insignia NS-DXA1, Manufactured by LG, a clone of the Zenith box above It is sold at Best Buy for \$59.


