Minutes, Members' Meeting of Oh-Ky-In ARS, Tuesday, October 7, 2008

Dale KC8HQS called the meeting to order at 7:35 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance. Self-introductions followed; there were 31 present, with 2 of the speakers as guests (Joe K8QOE and John NB4K). Health and Welfare: Dale said that Ted Wilson K8TCR's wife had died. It was mentioned that Otto AA8KK became SK after the last club meeting (notice in current *O-Fiver*).

Brag: Harry WA8LOJ bragged that on October 4 he and his wife celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary. Program: Gary KB8MYC turned it over to the ARRL officials present. Great Lakes Division Director Jim K8JE went first.

Jim deals with administrative matters, Section Manager Joe K8QOE makes the policies work.

Gene N8KOJ asked Jim about 40m phone; Jim replied that the FCC decides about that. There's also more than phone on 40m. Jim said there's a study proposed to look at the FCC regulations and get operating pleasantries in line for frequency users.

The ARRL actually keeps us on the air. BPL was supposed to deal with the abilities of incidental Part 15 devices to interfere, which some do. The FCC must review this under the basis of its own rules, which it violated. The suit cost over \$200K (could have cost \$100K more), and FCC must pay \$20K for copies and other needed printed material in the bench trial that decided this.

Amateur radio needs to develop a good presence in both Houses of Congress.

Section Manager Joe K8QOE handed out a few copies of the *Ohio Section Journal* before he began to speak.

5 Assistant Section Managers (by geographical area) assist Joe as part of the OH Section staff. The newly appointed SEC is working on linkages already. A lot of future traffic will be composed of long lists; digital stations will be needed to handle these. New blood is needed in the administrative ranks! The Technical Coordinator also operates a Speakers' Bureau.

Official Observer keeps no records. Most hams would far rather have an advisory OO note than a visit or letter from FCC enforcement.

Bruce N8BV asked why the recent Section Emergency Test seemed to be such a big secret, with little or no publicity? Joe admitted it got past him too, perhaps because of all the Hurricane Ike leftovers.

Joe commented, as a civilian, that a new controller on .88 will make it easier to air announcements that are not specifically club related. It's hoped this will happen by mid-November. Jim W8OUU will serve as contact for the GCARA repeaters.

Jim asked if Oh-Ky-In has experienced interference—with its repeaters, as some other—clubs have. Dale KC8HQS said there was a jammer on Tech Talk last week who—was ignored, and eventually gave up. John NB4K then asked how many had written a Congressman in support of legislation; only 2 had. He also said that the office of Homeland Security has declared ham radio as the back-up for FEMA. In general, SE Ohio and Michigan need to write their Congressmen and Senators more. John requested copies of such letters written.

Jim K8JE said Congressional staffs tend to cross-reference people who write as ARRL members. An important point: as few as 10 letters on a non-partisan issue is enough to get support for it as a logical worthy cause.

Dale thanked the speakers and announced a 10-minute break, during which split-the-pot tickets and soda will be sold.

E-mails Asking for Personal Information Are Not from ARRL (Oct 17, 2008) -- We have received several reports from ARRL members with arrl.net e-mail accounts who have recently been contacted via e-mail asking for personal information, such as user names and passwords. Please be assured that these e-mails are fraudulent attempts at "phishing" and did not originate from ARRL. According to ARRL Information Technology Manager Don Durand, "This is a very crude attempt at phishing, using an easily determined spoof of the originating/return address. There is never a time when we would ask via mass e-mail for user names and passwords of arrl.net users. There is simply no need to ever do so." If you receive an e-mail asking for personal information and it looks like it originated from ARRL, please do not respond, just delete it."

+++ Balloting in progress for Vice Director +++

Voting for Vice Director for the Great Lakes Division is in progress. Most Division members appear to have received their ballots; however, some may still be waiting for the US Postal Service to deliver theirs. Remember, the ballots were mailed by Bulk Mail. Times required for delivery of it are erratic.

If you do not receive a ballot by October 31, I encourage you to telephone Dave Sumner at 1-860=594-0303 or e-mail him at [k1zz@arrl.org] to request a replacement ballot be sent to you by First Class mail. Ballots must be received by noon on November 21.

Please review the candidates' backgrounds and vote. Be certain to place your ballot inside the "ballot" envelope and seal this in turn in the mailing envelope provided with your ballot. Ballots are to be mailed to the League's accounting firm, not to Headquarters.

What is the duty of the Vice Director? Article 5 of the ARRL governing documents specifies that the Vice Director has the power of "succession" (to become Director) in the event the Director becomes unable to serve. Otherwise, the Vice Director assists the Director (of the President) as requested and agreed.

+++ Red Cross is demanding Intellectual Property agreements +++

Red Cross appears to be expanding its legal agreement demands. This time, a few chapters in Ohio are demanding radio amateur volunteers to sign away their rights to intellectual property developed while a Red Cross volunteer. The local chapters say this is another requirement of American Red Cross at the national level.

Signing away ones intellectual rights -- rights to inventions or written "product" any of us develop -- is a potentially serious action. Many of us sign intellectual property agreements with employers. They pay us and deserve to receive the rewards of inventions we develop at work and in some instances when we are not at work. But signing away our ownership rights for innovations we develop just because we operate a radio to help our community in an emergency? This seems to be going just a bit overboard.

If you are asked to sign an intellectual rights agreement, I encourage you to evaluate the agreement thoroughly before you sign it. Having it reviewed by an attorney either on your personal behalf or the behalf of your ARES unit or club would be a good idea. Depending on the wording of the agreement the agreement just might require you to surrender the rights to a "better mousetrap" over to Red Cross if you happen to develop one.

ARRL does not recommend you refuse to sign an intellectual property agreement with the RC. What we suggest is that you review carefully a request by anyone to sign your rights over to them. Personally, I would graciously decline to sign any of my rights away if doing this is not in my families' or my own best interest.

+++ Pennsylvania is 29th state to pass antenna support bill +++

On Wednesday, October 8, Pennsylvania Governor Edward G. Rendell (D) signed into law a bill that guarantees radio amateurs the right to erect antenna support structures. Ohio members are requested to be ready to support Ohio House Bill No.563 which will place FCC Rule PRB-1 into Ohio law. This bill will require all government agencies in the state to allow amateurs to erect antenna support structure regardless of any current local, township or county ordnances.

What is an antenna support structure? If you haven't guessed, this is a "tower"; however, do not call them towers to non-hams. Non-amateurs automatically think of cell towers when someone refers to a tower. passage of Ohio HB 563. Working together, the job can be done. The law is non-partisan, costs nothing and merely puts into Ohio statutes the FCC rule that is already accepted as Ohio. The difference is that by putting PRB-1 into actual print in Ohio law, its existence cannot be "accidentally" overlooked by local officials who prefer to ignore it, now.

The U.S. Amateur Radio Call Sign History Restoration Project is the product of Michael Carroll N4MC of Woodbridge, Virginia. His Operation CQ is to encourage development of a true database of the history of Amateur Radio call signs. Michael requests your help in this project.

Operation CQ is all about assembling information so that any one of us

could go to it, search on a legitimate call sign and find who held it when. Now that FCC is re-issuing call signs after previous holders of them have given them up, wouldn't it be interesting to do this? Who was the first person to hold WA8COA or K8PGL or whatever, during what years and with what license classes? Ideally, wouldn't it be nice to find out who used license 2HT way back when?

For Michael's database to be able to do this, a lot of additional information -- history -- needs to be entered into his database. This is where you come in. Go to the *www.vanityhq.com* web site to enter your call sign history. In addition to entering information for call signs and their holders, one can look up call sign history that has already been provided. If you have information on friends or relatives who are SKs, you can enter this as well.

Operating tip

Acknowledging a QSO is important, particularly in short, intense contests like the North American Sprint. Even though you're in a hurry to get to that next QSO, be SURE to positively acknowledge the transmitting station's information. If you don't, the QSO might not be logged, leaving you with a NIL (not-in-log) penalty. On CW, sending a single "dit" is often lost in the noise or under other callers. 
If you need to access www.arrlohio.org, it's best to use the Microsoft Explorer browser.

*ARRL to Participate in Combined Federal Campaign:

For the 7th year running, the US Office of Personnel Management has designated the ARRL to participate in the 2008 Combined Federal Campaign (CFC) http://www.opm.gov/cfc/. In the past, this campaign for federal government civilian employees, US Postal Service workers and members of the military has generated more than \$120,000 for ARRL programs; in 2008 alone, ARRL has received \$37,475 in pledges from CFC participants and direct contributions of \$21,316. The CFC provides an easy way to support ARRL's effort to represent its members and all radio amateurs. Similar to the United Way, the CFC encourages individuals to pledge by payroll deduction to non-profit organizations of their choice. The ARRL encourages eligible radio amateurs to consider the League when designating campaign recipients. Payroll deduction through the CFC is an easy way for participants to support ARRL over and above their annual membership. Such contributions support programs that are not funded by member dues, enriching ARRL's ability to serve its members and all of Amateur Radio. Those wishing to select the ARRL to receive all or part of their payroll deductions should designate organization 10099 when completing their CFC donor forms. Donations to ARRL can be designated for Diamond Club contributions, the ARRL Spectrum Defense Fund or the ARRL Education & Technology Program. Donors may also make unrestricted contributions to the League. One important note: Since the CFC does not provide the ARRL with the names of individual donors, the ARRL Development Office <k1mmh@arrl.org>; would appreciate a copy of the donor form to ensure that each contribution is applied according to the donor's wishes and the contribution or pledge can be properly acknowledged. The 2008 CFC ends December 15.
