White House Names Ham as New Cybersecurity Coordinator

[Lawrence Jackson, official White House photo] On December 22, President Barack Obama named Howard A. Schmidt W7HAS as the new White House Cybersecurity Coordinator. According to the White House, Schmidt -- an ARRL member -- is one of the world's leading authorities on computer security, with some 40 years of experience in government, business and law enforcement and "will have regular access to the President and serve as a key member of his National Security Staff. He will also work closely with his economic team to ensure that our cybersecurity efforts keep the Nation secure and prosperous."

In an exclusive interview with the ARRL, Schmidt said that he credits Amateur Radio with getting him involved with technology: "In high school, one of my friends was a ham and he got me interested in

shortwave radio, which in turn got me into building shortwave radios and equipment, many from Heathkit. As I got older, I took courses from NRI and Bell and Howell in electronics and built a number of projects, preparing me for my first ham radio ticket. I love technology, and it was Amateur Radio that caused me to build my first computer -- a Sinclair ZX-80 to use for EME calculations. I studied all about the OSCAR systems and would build equipment to monitor when they would pass within range of Arizona. Building these computers to support my ham radio hobby gave me the technical skills that I needed to start doing computer crime investigations and work on the early stages of computer forensics, in turn enabling me to start working on cybersecurity issues."

ARRL Elects 15th President: Kay Craigie N3KN

As its first order of business at the 2010 Annual Meeting, the ARRL Board of Directors elected ARRL First Vice President Kay Craigie N3KN, of Blacksburg, Virginia, as the organization's new President. She will take over the reins from outgoing President Joel Harrison W5ZN at the close of the Annual Meeting. In October, Harrison advised the Board that he would not seek re-election.



The elections at the Annual Meeting generated a ripple effect of vacancies within the ARRL hierarchy. The elevation of Craigie to the presidency led to Vice President Rick Roderick K5UR being elected First Vice President and Midwest Division Director Bruce Frahm K0BJ elected to the Vice President position. This created a vacancy in the Director position in the Midwest Division, so Vice Director Cliff Ahrens K0CA will take over as Director. Dakota Division Director Jay Bellows K0QB was elected International Vice President; Dakota Division Vice Director Greg Widin K0GW will move up to Director in that Division. ARRL

Technical Relations Manager Brennan Price N4QX was elected ARRL Chief Technology Officer. He replaces Paul Rinaldo W4RI who retired from the staff in 2008 but retained the officer title through the end of its two-year term.

One of Craigie's first items of business as League President will be to appoint new Vice Directors in both the Midwest and Dakota Divisions. "I'm excited about working with the new team of officers to carry out the Board's directives here in the US and internationally in cooperation with the IARU," she said after the election. "All the way back to the League's founding in 1914, Amateur Radio has always existed in a challenging environment. The League will continue meeting today's challenges so hams can continue to serve the public, explore technology and have fun on the bands."

First licensed in 1983, Craigie has been a Volunteer Examiner for more than 20 years, now working with the New River Valley Amateur Radio Club's team. In 1986, she became ARRL Section Manager for Eastern Pennsylvania, moving up to Atlantic Division Vice Director in 1990. Six years later, she became Atlantic Division Director; in 2000 she was elected Vice President and in 2006 First Vice President of the ARRL. She has served on all the standing committees of the ARRL Board of Directors and also worked on the League's Enforcement Task Force, the committee whose pressure finally resulted in the FCC's assigning Riley Hollingsworth to clean up the ham bands.

Craigie's first assignment as Vice President was to design what became the ARRL Education & Technology Program.

Later, she chaired the National Emergency Response Planning Committee, tasked with recommendations on the League's readiness at the national level to respond to extraordinary disasters. In 2009, she chaired the ad-hoc committee that produced *The Commercialization of Amateur Radio: The Rules, The Risks, The Issues*. This document offers guidelines to assist radio amateurs and anyone wishing to utilize the capabilities of Amateur Radio in understanding the FCC Rules that prohibit communications in which the amateur has a pecuniary interest, including communications on behalf of an employer.

On the air, Craigie enjoys DXing -- that's what attracted her to ham radio in the first place -- award-hunting and contesting. She holds VUCC on 6 meters, 5BDXCC (endorsed for 12, 17 and 30 meters), the DXCC Challenge award, WAZ and WAE Class 1 CW. She enjoys digital modes such as RTTY and PSK31, as well as CW and phone. She is involved with SKYWARN through the National Weather Service Forecast Office in Blacksburg, Virginia.

Craigie's husband, Carter N3AO, is a retired college professor. He has served as a Section Traffic Manager and as an ARES® Emergency Coordinator. He especially enjoys QRP and operating outdoors on the Appalachian Trail. He is also a SKYWARN volunteer. Their daughter Jenny Riffe KA3WVD also lives in Virginia with her husband and two children.

ARLB002 Kent Olson KA0LDG Appointed Dakota Division Vice Director

In one of her first actions as ARRL President, Kay Craigie N3KN has appointed Dakota Division Assistant Director and former North Dakota Section Manager Kent Olson KA0LDG as the new Dakota Division Vice Director. The position became vacant when Dakota Division Director Jay Bellows K0QB was elected

International Affairs Vice President at the 2010 ARRL Board of Directors Annual Meeting and Vice Dir. Greg Widin K0GW moved into the Director position. The Q-Jivez, Oh-Ky-In ARS, Jebzuazy 2010, page 9 A native of North Dakota, Olson -- an ARRL Life Member -- was first licensed in 1981 while in high school; he earned his Amateur Extra license in 1997. Olson served as the North Dakota Section Manager from 2001-2008 where he told the ARRL that he had the opportunity to get to know hams throughout North Dakota.

"I am very excited and honored that ARRL President Kay Craigie chose me to fill the Dakota Division Vice Director position -- this has to be the best thing that has happened to me in ham radio," Olson told the ARRL. "It will be a pleasure to work with Dakota Division Director Greg Widin in representing the Dakota Division. I am fully committed to help in any way I can to promote the League, its policies and Amateur Radio as a whole."

While still in high school, Olson enlisted in the North Dakota Air National Guard (119th Wing) as a Munitions Systems Specialist. After basic training, he worked on guided missiles for the F-4 (Phantom II). After completing his degree at North Dakota State University, he was selected to become a Weapons Systems Officer (WSO) in the F-4 and became a commissioned officer. "I did that for a couple of years until the unit converted to the F-16 (Fighting Falcon). I then was able to go to pilot training and became an F-16 pilot in 1991. I have held a lot of positions in the Wing and am now the Vice Wing Commander with the rank of Colonel." He has more than 3100 hours in the cockpit.

When Olson flew the F-16, he had the unique opportunity to operate HF aeromobile and make quite a few contacts to hams around the world: "Talk about pileups. The F-16s we had were specifically modified with an HF radio, and occasionally I could make contacts while traveling cross country." Now that his unit has switched from the F-16 to the C-21, he said he doesn't get to do as much aeromobile as he would like, since his duties as Vice Wing Commander keep him fairly busy.

As the Dakota Division's ham population concentration is in Minnesota, Director Widin said he knows that members and ham radio events and needs span all three Sections: Minnesota, South Dakota and North Dakota: "I wanted someone who could help extend the ARRL presence across the Sections. Kent brings experience and an enthusiastic approach to the job. I'm glad we can add him to the Dakota Division team. Hams who know Kent have already been congratulating me on his appointment; Dakota Division members who don't yet know him will soon be congratulating themselves at getting such a competent and dedicated individual for Vice Director."

Olson is the past president of the Red River Radio Amateurs (RRRA), the largest Amateur Radio club in North Dakota. He is an ARRL Volunteer Examiner and an ARRL Certified Instructor. An active participant in SKYWARN, emergency communications and public service events in the area, Olson is a graduate of all three ARRL Emergency Communications courses. He helped craft a Fargo city ordinance that allows hams to erect antenna support structures.

Olson enjoys chasing DX and rag chewing: "I have a modest station and have worked the world with 100 W on either a vertical or dipole." He likes contesting "to give North Dakota out to those who need multipliers (and not really to set any world records)." ARRL Field Day, kit building and Jamboree on the Air round out his radio interests.

Olson has been married to his wife Lisa for 21 years; they have two boys -- Quinn, 13, and Ian, 9. Quinn got his Technician license last year through Boy Scouts; his call is KD0GWA. Olson is active with both Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts and is also involved with 4H Lego Robotics. The family enjoys everything from building with Legos to bike riding and other outdoor activities.

ARLX003 Haiti Amateur Radio Frequency Update/Reciprocal Operating Clearance (posted Jan 25) Considering the improving communications situation in Haiti, Dr Cesar Pio Santos HR2P, IARU Region 2 EMCOR, announced the release of HF frequencies, including 7.045 and 3.720 MHz, for normal use. He states, "We thank the world radio amateur community for their support in keeping these frequencies clear during the past days."

In addition, CONATEL (the Haitian Telecomm regulator) has set up temporary offices and released a public notice. Amateurs wishing to operate in Haiti to assist with disaster relief need to contact CONATEL to get formal reciprocal operating clearance.

The text of the CONATEL public notice is as follows:

"The National Council of Telecommunications (CONATEL) hereby notifies the general public, and those particularly impacted, that following the widespread damage caused by the violent earthquake of January

12, 2010, a satellite office of CONATEL was installed at Number 97 of the Avenue Panaméricaine in Pétion-Ville with the goal of assuring the continuity of its work. This arrangement will allow, among other things, better coordination for establishing a temporary emergency telecommunications network in Haiti. Consequently, all concerned are asked to contact CONATEL at the above mentioned address between 9 AM and 1 PM and throughout the day at the following telephone numbers: (you must dial the international calling code 011 and then the Haitian country code 509 first): 3454-0541, 2516-0000 or 3702-1414, or at these e-mail addresses: <techommunication@yahoo.fr> or <info@conatel.gouv.ht> before any use of telecommunications equipment or the spectrum resources.

We hope to avoid interference problems and possible conflicts between the incumbent operators established in Haiti and those who are newly operating in this unusual circumstance".

The National Council of Telecommunications (CONATEL), while thanking the telecommunications service providers for all their efforts to keep their networks operational despite the widespread damage that has been noted, takes this opportunity to offer its sympathies to the families of the victims of the earth-quake. FCC-ConsumerNews: Wireless Microphones

Under a new FCC rule, anyone who uses a **wireless microphone** that operates in the **700 MHz Band** must **stop** operating their wireless microphone no later than June 12, 2010. All users of 700 MHz Band wireless microphones (and similar devices) - including theaters, churches, schools, conference centers, theme parks, and musicians -- will need to **retune** (where possible) or **replace** their wireless microphone equipment with other microphone devices no later than June 12, 2010. This action helps complete an important component of the DTV Transition by clearing the 700 MHz band to enable the rollout of communications services for public safety and the deployment of next generation 4G wireless devices for consumers.
