Making DX Spots interactive in the Q-Fiver 's electronic edition has been one of Nathan KA3MTT's projects over the last few issues – but there have been some challenges. For one thing, when Nathan designs the calendar with links to DXpeditions, the calendar prefers to travel to Ye Ed's only in a PDF. This creates a few more challenges, as PDFs don't insert into Word documents like graphics do, and there seems to be a shrinkage factor as well. Nathan constructs the calendar table to fit the space; when Ye Ed FastStone Captures it from the PDF (seems to be only way to get it out), it's rather smaller. Text quality also suffers, and is made even worse by increasing size to fill allotted space. This has led to Ye Ed feeling she has to re-construct the column so it can be read, which destroys the interactive properties of the DXpedition links. A solution may be an original column created and tested by Nathan, traveling along with the Q-Fiver electronic edition. Electronic subscribers should get that this time! OPERATING TIP from Oct 13 ARRL Contest Update ed by Ward Silver NOAX

The ARRL November Sweepstakes is a common first contest for new HF operators since even small stations can make a lot of contacts around the US and Canada. For those new contesters, it can be a challenge to navigate the rules and log submission process. To address those needs, the ARRL has released a first version at getting all the rules - contest-specific, general, and HF - into one convenient package. It's available on the Sweepstakes Web page as an "Operating Guide" and includes a "how to play" overview, a number of references to contest operating information, log sheets and entry forms, and examples of known-good Cabrillo headers for each operating category. Eventually, there will be one of these for each ARRL contest.

Ohio Section Cabinet Openings Available

After many years of service to the Ohio SSection, Technical Coordinator Tom Holmes N8ZM and Affiliated Club Coordinator Joanne Solak KJ3O have announced their retirement from the Ohio Section. I thank both Tom and Joanne for their many years of service, and will miss their hard work and dedication to the Ohio Section. In the meantime, Assistant Section Manager Scott Yonally N8SY will continue to serve as interim ACC, and Tom has agreed to stay on until a new appointment is made.

This leaves two job openings for fulfillment. The job descriptions follow:

AFFILIATED CLUB COORDINATOR:

The ACC is the primary contact and resource person for each Amateur Radio club in the section, specializing in motivating, providing assistance and coordinating joint activities of radio clubs. The ACC is appointed by, and reports to, the Section Manager. Duties and qualifications of the ACC include the following:

- 1. Get to know the Amateur Radio clubs' members and officers person to person in his/her section. Learn their needs, strengths and interests and work with them to make clubs effective resources in their communities and more enjoyable for their members.
- 2. Encourage affiliated clubs in the section to become more active and, if the club is already healthy and effective, to apply as a Special Service Club (SSC).
- 3. Supply interested clubs with SSC application forms.
- 4. Assist clubs in completing SSC application forms.
- 5. Help clubs establish workable programs to use as SSCs.
- 6. Approve SSC application forms and pass them to the SM.
- 7. Work with other section leadership officials (Section Emergency Coordinator, Public Information Coordinator, Technical Coordinator, State Government Liaison, etc.) to insure that clubs are involved in the mainstream of ARRL Field Organization activities.
- 8. Encourage new clubs to become ARRL affiliated.
- 9. Ensure that annual reports (updates officers, liaison mailing addresses etc.) are forthcoming from all affiliated clubs.
- 10. Full ARRL membership is a requirement.

TECHNICAL COORDINATOR

The ARRL Technical Coordinator (TC) is a section-level official appointed by the Section Manager to coordinate all technical activities within the section. The Technical Coordinator must be an ARRL Full

member holding a Novice class (or higher) amateur license. The Technical Coordinator reports to the Section Manager and is expected to maintain contact with other section-level appointees as appropriate to insure a unified ARRL Field Organization within the section. The duties of the Technical Coordinator are as follows:

- 1. Supervise and coordinate the work of the section's Technical Specialists (TSs).
- 2. Encourage amateurs in the section to share their technical achievements with others through the pages of *QST*, and at club meetings, hamfests and conventions.
- 3. Promote technical advances and experimentation at vhf/uhf and with specialized modes, and work closely with enthusiasts in these fields within the section.
- 4. Serve as an advisor to radio clubs that sponsor training programs for obtaining amateur licenses or upgraded licenses in cooperation with the ARRL Affiliated Club Coordinator.
- 5. In times of emergency or disaster, function as the coordinator for establishing an array of equipment for communications use and be available to supply technical expertise to government and relief agencies to set up emergency communications networks, in cooperation with the ARRL Section Emergency Coordinator.
- 6. Refer amateurs in the section who need technical advice to local TSs.
- 7. Encourage clubs to develop, and TSs to serve on, RFI and TVI committees in the section for the purpose of rendering technical assistance as needed.
- 8. Be available to assist local technical program committees in arranging suitable programs for ARRL hamfests and conventions.
- 9. Convey the views of section amateurs and TSs about the technical contents of *QST* and ARRL books to ARRL HQ. Suggestions for improvements should also be called to the attention of the ARRL HQ technical staff.
- 10. Work with the appointed ARRL TAs (technical advisors) when called upon.
- 11. Be available to give technical talks at club meetings, hamfests and conventions in the section. With both appointments, recruitment of new hams and ARRL members is an integral part of the job of every ARRL appointee. Appointees should take advantage of every opportunity to recruit a new ham or member to foster growth of Field Organization programs, and our abilities to serve the public. Amateurs interested in either of these positions are encouraged to apply directly to me via e-mail <ki8gw@arrl.org> or by standard mail (496 Hillview Street, Pickerington, Ohio 43147) **no later than November 3, 2010**. Successful applicants will be contacted for an interview, and the new appointments will be made no later than November 15, 2010.

International Spotlight:

Dr Hamadoun Touré, HB9EHT, Re-elected ITU Secretary-General



On October 7 during the morning session of the 18th ITU Plenipotentiary Conference -- held in Guadalajara, Mexico -- Member States of the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) re-elected Dr Hamadoun Touré, HB9EHT, of Mali, as ITU Secretary-General. This will be his second four-year term. Dr Touré, who ran unopposed, won the position with 151 votes, with 157 countries present and voting.

The next day, François Rancy of France was elected as Director of the ITU's Radiocommunication Bureau (BR), capturing 90 of 157 votes. The BR plays a key role in global communications, managing the distribution of international frequency spectrum and the allocation of satellite orbits. According to the ITU, Rancy will face several challenges, including WRC-12. The conference will

tackle issues that include a review of the international framework for radiocommunication (including Amateur Radio), the identification of appropriate mechanisms to address what the ITU called "the so-called digital dividend of radio spectrum" freed up by the switch to digital TV and the identification of spectrum resources for maritime, aeronautical, meteorological and climatology.

His responsibilities will include reviewing and organizing resources needed by instructors, teachers and Scout leaders, developing lesson plans to be utilized by ARRL Registered Instructors and for the ARRL's Education & Technology Program (ETP), providing guidance in the development of ARRL license study manuals and coordinating the ARRL's educational award program. In addition, Rykard will provide support for the ETP, participate in the Teachers Institute trainings, help to provide ongoing
