ARLD028 Republic of South Sudan Is Now a DXCC Entity

At 10:18 AM (EDT) on Thursday, July 14, the UN General Assembly met to vote on whether or not to admit the Republic of South Sudan as its 193^{rd} member state. The Republic of South Sudan was unanimously admitted and is now a member of the United Nations; a two-thirds majority is needed to become a member of the UN. (ARRL says there are now 340 active DXCC Entities, per its list. -- $ye \in d$)

Immediately following the General Assembly meeting, the flag of the Republic of South Sudan flew for the first time in front of the UN, ceremoniously marking its membership in the UN.

Now that the Republic of South Sudan is a member of the United Nations, the new country is now a DXCC entity by way of Section II, 1(a) of the DXCC rules. The DXCC Desk will begin immediately accepting QSOs for this new entity, with a start date of July 14, 2011.

CQ Ohio Hams! Stations from across Ohio are making plans to be on the air for one of the premier state QSO parties: the **Ohio QSO Party** (OhQP). We hope you will join the fun on Saturday, August 27.

People from around the world are seeking out Ohio stations in this event and it's a fun time for Ohio stations to be on the air and be the hunted station, or "DX". The OhQP occurs on Saturday August 27, 2010 from local noon to local midnight (12 short hours).

In the basic QSO exchange, Ohio stations send a consecutive serial number + county, and non-Ohio stations (who can only work Ohio) send a consecutive serial number and their state, VE province, or "DX". Suggested frequencies are: SSB 3825, 7200, 14,250, 21,300, and 28,450 kHz

CW: 3545, 7045, 14,045,21,045, 28,045 kHz

When you get on the air, try calling CQ in addition to searching and pouncing. Remember, everyone is tuning the bands looking for Ohio stations -- your CQs will be answered! Full details and an OhQP operating guide can be found on the official website at: *www.ohqp.org*

This is a great event for a club activity or a training ground for new(er) hams. QSO rates are as high or higher than Field Day, and there's virtually no QRM in this event. Round up the club and have some fun. If you are in the mood to enjoy the great Ohio countryside, try operating portable or mobile from a rare county. Remember, the ultimate goal is to just get on the air and have some fun!

Meet the ARRL Second Century Campaign Committee

At the end of April, David W. Brandenburg K5RQ of Osprey, FL, agreed to chair the ARRL Second Century Campaign. This multi-million dollar campaign will focus on building the ARRL Endowment to further secure resources to fund the League's commitment to the future. One important focus of the campaign includes the development of a robust national program geared at young people, enabling them to experience and develop skills in scientific and technological discovery through Amateur Radio.

Introduced at the Annual ARRL Donor Reception -- held in Dayton just prior to the Dayton Hamvention --Brandenburg shared the vision of the campaign to the more than 150 guests. He told of the impact that Amateur Radio has had on his personal and professional life and why he decided to accept the leadership of the Second Century Campaign. Brandenburg then introduced the members of the Second Century Campaign Committee: Mike Valentine W8MM of Cincinnati,OH; Bob Allphin K4UEE of Marietta, GA; Frank Donovan W3LPL of Glenwood, MD; Ken Byers K4TEA of Atlanta, GA, and L. Dennis Shapiro W1UF of Chestnut Hill, MA. During Hamvention, Glenn Johnson W0GJ of Bemidji, MN, also joined the committee. ARRL President Kay Craigie N3KN and Vice President Rick Roderick K5UR are also on the Second Century Campaign Committee, as are ARRL Chief Executive Officer David Sumner K1ZZ, Chief Financial Officer Barry Shelley N1VXY, and Chief Development Officer Mary Hobart K1MMH. All members of the committee serve in a volunteer capacity.

Attendees at the reception noted that Brandenburg's remarks mirrored their own experiences, giving them pause to think about how much Amateur Radio has meant to them and how they can join him in supporting the ARRL's future. Brandenburg said he plans to add two or three additional volunteers to the group before the first working committee meeting, to be held August 11 at ARRL Headquarters.

The Second Century Campaign is planned to last through ARRL's centennial year in 2014. More informa-tion on this important initiative will be soon forthcoming.

But her lack of chronologic age is more than made up for by her selfless dedication to her community and the youth of Alabama through her chosen hobby/service of amateur radio.



On April 27, 2011, the Huntsville, Alabama area, including the small community of

Harvest, was hit by a series of destructive tornadoes. The severe weather took a heavy toll in lives lost and property damaged.

Electrical service was out for over a week. Kaitlyn and her father immediately volunteered to help with amateur radio relief activities. Kaitlyn began by logging contacts and running errands, but in short order took on the role of Net Control Station, working for many days from 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. With cellular and wireline telephone coverage being spotty to non-existent, Kaitlyn's duties as Net Control involved dispatching amateur radio operators with chainsaws (and other rubble clearance machinery) and debris pickup teams. For her efforts, Kaitlyn received many compliments from veteran operators on the profess-ionalism that she displayed during this crisis situation.

Kaitlyn is also Assistant Section Manager for Youth Activities in the ARRL Alabama section. In this role, she visits many hamfests where she speaks to other young hams. Kaitlyn has also volunteered her services the past three years at the ARRL Expo Youth Lounge at the Dayton Hamvention[©] and ran a special event operation to honor the local Volunteer Fire Department in her hometown.

A straight-A student entering sixth grade this fall, the 11-year old also enjoys home-brewing and construction, and has posted on YouTube a video of herself building a QRP transceiver (see <u>http://www.youtube.com/watch?</u> <u>v=_SK55sbxOj4</u> and related videos). Kaitlyn hopes her videos will encourage others to pick up a soldering iron and enjoy one of the finest traditions of ham radio.

The daughter of Stanley (NX3P) and Amy Cole, Kaitlyn joined the amateur radio fraternity at the tender age of 8. She passed her Technician exam in September 2009, her General in October 2009, and her Extra Class on January 3, 2011. Since then, Kaitlyn has participated in many amateur radio activities, with a special emphasis on the public service and youth activity aspects of the hobby.

Foxhunters Prepare for National and IARU ARDF Championships in Albuquerque

Fans of on-foot hidden transmitter hunts are getting ready for the most important event of their year: The annual USA Championships of Amateur Radio Direction Finding (ARDF) will take place in forests near Albuquerque NM September 14-18, 2011. USA's national championships are being combined with the championships of International Amateur Radio Union (IARU) Region 2 (North and South America.)

The activities get under way on Wednesday, September 14 with a two-day optional training camp where beginners and experts can hone their radio-orienteering skills. Formal activities begin on Friday with a competitor meeting and an equipment testing session, called a model event. The championship 2 meter competition will begin early on Saturday in a nearby forest, followed by an awards banquet that evening. On Sunday, the 80 meter competition and medal award ceremony will take place in a different location.

USA's ARDF Championships are open to anyone of any age who can safely navigate in the woods with handheld radio gear for several kilometers. An Amateur Radio license is not a requirement. Medals will be awarded for the top three finishers on each band in 10 age categories: six for males and four for females.

And as far as laying those radials...why dig when your lawn will bury the radials for you? Cut your grass very short - then within hours lay the radials by hand, held down by galvanized landscape pins (a short piece of galvanized wire bent double works just fine) and with the end of each wire wrapped around a pin pushed deep. Set the mower a bit higher for the next few cuttings. Water to keep the sod growing at a fast rate - if needed. In 4 weeks or so all radials will self-bury and be gone under the sod. After 5 years the radials are down about 6 inches - all on their own. (Thanks, Tim K3LR) Tim also came up with a great way to bury coax - since the let-the-yardgrow-over-it technique doesn't work well with coax. He recommends using pressure-washer to cut the trench. It does have a *little* tendency to splatter but neither will it cut buried cables like a ditch-digging machine. Don't ask him how he knows this. (Photo by K3LR) -- ARRL Contest Update 7-6-2011
