

ARRL Announces New DXCC Fee Structure; snips from May *QST*

New fee structure is available online at www.arrl.org/files/media/News2012_DXCC_FeeStructure.pdf. Queries to dxccadmin@arrl.org.

On & after April 2, 2012:

- 1. No more hybrid applications. Each DXCC application of whatever type will be considered a separate application with separate application fees.
- 2. No limit on number of applications that may be submitted, & no more surcharges.
- 3. Traditional paper QSL application will haven \$15 application fee for ARRL members, \$35 for non-members outside US. Applications may include up to 101 QSOs; additional QSOs in this sort of application will still cost \$.15 each.
- 4. A DXCC application using LoTW will cost \$5 for ARRL members, \$10 for non-members. There is no limit on number of QSOs that may be included in a LoTW application. Each QSO used in LoTW for an award will cost \$.12, down from \$.15 last year. LoTW credits are no longer sold in "bulk" but stored credits may be used.
- 5. DXCC staff will mail no paperwork for LoTW applications, as all info will be available online in the LoTW User account.
- 6. An Online DXCC Application will cost \$7.50 for ARRL members, \$12.50 for non-members. This may include 101 QSOs; additional are \$.08 each. This application is primarily intended to be used with field checkers, but can be used by applicants who do not have access to a card checker & are willing to ship cards to ARRL HQ.
- 7. Certificates still cost \$14 delivered in the US, \$16.50 outside. Pins continue to cost \$7 delivered anywhere.
- 8. The fee for an initial DXCC award is now the same as for any DXCC application.
- 9. The free *DXCC Yearbook* that was sent to ARRL members will now be available electronically, in an edition of Digital *QST*. The printed *Yearbook* will remain available at a modest cost.

ARLB007 FCC Seeks Public Comments on Emergency Communications by Amateur Radio and Impediments to Amateur Radio Communications posted Apr 5, 2012, full text avail at arrl.org In response to the Congressional directive to prepare a study to assess Amateur Radio's role in emergency and disaster communications and the impact of private land use regulations on the amateur community's ability to provide such communications, the FCC issued DA 12-523 soliciting comments from the public. The period for public comment runs until May 17, 2012.

"As part of the study contained in Public Law No. 112-96, the Commission has opened a 45 day period for comments to be filed on the issue," said ARRL Regulatory Information Manager Dan Henderson N1ND. "Because of the short deadline for the study to be completed and presented to Congress -- before the end of August -- the ARRL and the amateur community must quickly mobilize their response."

The FCC Public Notice focuses on two specific areas for comments. The first is the role that Amateur Page 4

ARLX002 Fred Maia W5YI, (SK) posted March 30, 2012

The holder of one of the best-known US Amateur Radio call signs, Frederick (Fred) Maia W5YI, died of cancer Wednesday, March 28. He was 76 and was a resident of Arlington, Texas.

Fred was a leading Amateur Radio journalist for nearly 35 years and a pioneer of the volunteer examining program adopted by the FCC in 1984.

Maia published *The W5YI Report*, dubbed "America's Oldest Ham Radio Newsletter," from 1978 to 2003, and has been a *CQ* contributing editor since 1985. His regulatory affairs column, first titled "Ticket Talk," then "Washington Readout," offered news and perspective on FCC Regulations and ITU actions. His final column will appear in the May 2012 issue of *CQ*.

Ohio amateurs' antenna legislation cleared a major hurdle today when **H.B. 158 was approved by the Ohio Senate**. The Bill has now passed, though with minor differences, in both the Ohio House and the Ohio

Senate and our ultimate goal of having this legislation become law appears to be within reach. The two remaining steps are, first, consideration by the House of the amendments made by the Senate. Those amendments essentially deleted the 75' "presumption" of reasonableness for tower height. The standard under the bill as passed is similar to that required by FCC regulation PRB-1, which is "reasonable accommodation" and "minimum practicable" regulation of antennas. Unlike PRB-1, however, the Ohio legis-lation places the burden of proof on any legislative authority denying a request for zoning variance to demonstrate compliance with the Ohio statute.

We believe that the House will be supportive of the changes made by the Senate, as both of the primary sponsors, Representatives Stebelton and Okey, have indicated their support and members often defer to the Sponsors when differences such as these arise. Following House reconsideration the next stop is Governor Kasich, who must approve the legislation in order for it to become law. Even that approval does not instantly transform the Bill into law, as a 90 day waiting period will be required before the law goes into effect. Notwithstanding all of that, today's vote was a milestone in our nearly 5 year effort to secure passage of this legislation. We continue to believe that this legislation will make it easier for many Ohio amateurs to more fully enjoy their hobby as well as to prepare for and participate in emergency communications as the need arises.

Revised Bylaws follow:

OH-KY-IN AMATEUR RADIO SOCIETY, INC. <u>BY-LAWS</u>

ARTICLE I. MEMBERSHIP

- A. Any person interested in amateur radio and who is in sympathy with the purposes of this society may become a member upon completing an application for membership and payment of dues; but holding of an office shall be limited to F. C. C. licensed amateurs who are also members of the American Radio Relay League, Inc.
- B. Student members who pay no dues have no voting rights.

ARTICLE II. DUES

A. The dues shall be an amount determined by a majority of the membership, payable to the Treasurer at or before the meeting during the month of January. Dues unpaid three months after the due date shall result in automatic termination of membership.

ARTICLE III. OFFICERS AND THEIR ELECTION

- A. The elective officers of this society shall be a President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and three Directors. These officers shall be elected annually by written ballot at the December meeting by members present and voting. All of the elected officers must be licensed Amateur Radio operators licensed by the Federal Communications Commission. A majority of the elected officers must be members of the American Radio Relay League.
- B. The Board of Directors shall consist of the elected officers, the elected directors and the immediate Past Presidents of the society who serves ex officio, provided that all members of the Board of Directors must be current members of the society. Vacancies occurring in offices shall be filled for the remainder of the term by appointment of the Board of Directors.

Officers of the Society shall serve one year terms. The Directors of the Society shall serve three year terms. For the initial election of three year term Directors, the person with the highest vote count shall be elected to a three year term, the person with the second highest vote count shall be elected to a two year term, and the person with the third highest vote count shall be elected to a one year term.

C. Five Four officers and/or Directors shall form a quorum of the Board of Directors.

- D. The President shall appoint a three member nominating committee and also chairpersons for all standing committees. Terms for the nominating committee and chairpersons of all standing committees shall be one year and shall run concurrently with the elected officers.
- E. The Nominating Committee shall submit at the November meeting, names of selected candidates for each of the five four officers and three one Directors (except as provided above for the initial election of three year directors). Additional nominations may be made by members from the floor at this meeting.
- F. Election to office from the list of candidates shall take place at the December meeting and election shall be by majority vote. All elected officers and directors will be installed in office at the first regular membership meeting following their election. after the beginning of the new calendar year.
- G. Vacancies occurring in offices shall be filled for the remainder of the term by appointment by the Board of Directors.
- An auditing committee of three members shall be appointed by the President at the November meeting. The financial records and all equipment and property of the society shall be audited and a report submitted as soon as possible after the end of the fiscal year (calendar year).

ARTICLE IV. DUTIES OF OFFICERS

- A. The President shall preside at all meetings of the society and shall be a member ex-officio of all committees, and shall perform all other duties usually pertaining to the office. The President or the President's appointee will make reports relative to the activities of the members of the society, as required for affiliation of the society with the American Radio Relay League.
- B. The Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President and shall act as aide to the President.
- C. The Recording Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all meetings of the society, and keep a roster of members. The Corresponding-Secretary shall conduct the official correspondence of the society and be responsible for acquiring information, and maintaining records.
- D. The Corresponding Secretary shall-conduct the official correspondence of the society and be responsible for acquiring information, and maintaining records.

, and making reports relative to the activities of the members of the society, as required for affiliation of the society with the American Radio Relay League.

- The Treasurer shall be custodian of all the funds of the society, and shall be responsible for the safe keeping of such funds. The Treasurer shall keep an accurate itemized account of all receipts and expenditures and pay bills as authorized by the Board of Directors. The Treasurer shall render a report at each meeting of the society. The Treasurer shall also maintain a list of all property owned by the society and the name of the person or persons to whom such property is entrusted. The Treasurer shall be responsible for filing all necessary reports to the State of Ohio and the United States Internal Revenue Service. Such reports shall be filed at such time as stipulated by the various agencies of the above so as not to incur any penalties for late filing.
- E. Expenditures of more than \$1000 must be approved by the membership prior to committing to the expenditure.

ARTICLE V. MEETINGS [Moved from Article VI.]

A. Regular monthly or bi-monthly meetings shall be held from January through December. The date of regular meetings shall be selected by the Board of Directors at its November meeting and published in the

Q-FIVER members present at any regular meeting, providing the date of change be first published in the Q-FIVER or by written notice to the membership prior to the proposed new meeting date. The meetings of this society shall be open to the public, but the privilege of making motions, debating or voting shall be limited to members of the society.

- B. Special membership meetings may be called by the President, or by the Vice President in the President's former's absence, due notice of seven (7) days being given. 20% of the Society's membership may petition for a special meeting of the membership. The petition shall be presented to the President, or to the Vice-President in the President's absence. The petition must state the business to be conducted at the special meeting, and only that business may be conducted at that special meeting.

 Notice of any special meeting must be distributed to the membership at least 15 calendar days prior to the date of the special meeting.
 - C. The Board of Directors shall hold regular monthly or bi-monthly meetings. The President, or in the absence of the President the vice-President, may cancel a meeting if there is no business to conduct. Board meetings are open to members, so the date and location of Board Meetings must be distributed to the membership in advance of each meeting.

ARTICLE VI. OFFICIAL PUBLICATION

A. The official publication of the society will be called the Q-FIVER. It shall be published monthly and **distributed** mailed to all members in good standing. The editor shall be appointed by the President. It is the responsibility of the Editor to maintain the editorial policy of the publication consistent with the policies and practices of the society.

ARTICLE VII. AMENDMENTS

A. These BY-LAWS may be amended at any regular business meeting at which there is a quorum, by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present, providing that the Board of Directors has previously considered the amendment.

An attendance of at least 30% of the membership shall constitute a quorum for the purpose of amending the BY-LAWS.

These BY-LAWS may also be amended by a 2/3 vote of the membership, the balloting being conducted by mail.

B. No amendment shall be put to a vote **at a membership meeting** unless published in the official publication and shall have been **distributed** mailed to each member in good standing at least **28 days** one (1) week previous to the regular meeting.

ARTICLE VIII. PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

A. The rules in ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER, REVISED, shall govern the society in all cases to which they are applicable.

ARTICLE IX. FORFEITURE OF MEMBERSHIP

A.— Any member may be expelled for a cause by a vote of 51% of the membership.
