ARRL Welcomes NASA Astronaut Lee Morin KF5DDB to 2012 National Convention

NASA Astronaut Lee Morin KF5DDB will be a special guest at the <u>2012 ARRL National Convention</u> at Pacificon, held October 12-14, in Santa Clara CA. Morin, an ARRL member, served as a Mission Specialist on *Atlantis* for <u>STS-110</u> that

launched in April 2002. During this 13th shuttle mission to the International Space Station (<u>ISS</u>), he performed two extravehicular activities (<u>EVA</u>s) -- also known as spacewalks -- the first time that the station's robotic arm was used to maneuver spacewalkers around the station. Morin currently serves in the US Navy at the rank of Captain. He also holds an MD and a PhD in Microbiology, both from New York University.

Pacificon attendees will have the chance to meet and greet Morin in the ARRL exhibit area (times and locations will be posted). He will also present a forum at Pacificon and will be the speaker at Saturday night's banquet where he will share his experiences about spaceflight and his interests in Amateur Radio. ARRL Chief Execu-tive Officer David Sumner K1ZZ has also been confirmed as a banquet speaker.


NASA ISS Ham Radio Project Engineer Kenneth Ransom N5VHO, a key member of the Amateur Radio on the International Space Station (ARISS) program working group, will also be a guest of the ARRL at Pacificon; ARISS is a cooperative venture of NASA, the ARRL, AMSAT and other international space agencies that orga-nizes scheduled contacts via Amateur Radio between astronauts and cosmonauts aboard the ISS and classrooms and communities. The ARISS program provides an educational opportunity for students, teachers and the gener-al public to learn about wireless technology and space science through Amateur Radio, inspiring interest in science, technology, engineering and math.

+ IARU Supports Proposal for .radio Domain Name in ARRL Ltr for 8-30-12



The International Amateur Radio Union (<u>IARU</u>) has expressed public support for a <u>radio top-level domain name</u>. Under the proposal as put forth by the European Broadcasting Union (<u>EBU</u>), registration will be available via the EBU to all eligible radio representative organizations and broadcasters, Internet radios, radio amateurs, radio professionals and their respective representative organizations, as well as companies providing radio-specific products and services in order to create a worldwide radio community.

The proposal must be approved by the Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers (<u>ICANN</u>); this organization is responsible for the coordination of the global Internet's systems of unique identifiers and, in particular, ensuring its stable and secure operation. Much of its work has concerned the Domain Name Space (DNS) policy development for internationalization of the DNS system and introduction of new generic top-level domains (TLDs), such as .com, .edu, .org, .net and the new .aero, .xxx and .travel.

In a <u>letter</u> to ICANN Chairman Steve Crocker, IARU President Tim Ellam, VE6SH, <u>said</u> that "the IARU believes that the **.radio** proposal submitted

by the EBU provides a unique opportunity to standardize radio domain names on the Internet. The use of a specific global online name such as **.radio** can help create a unique space worldwide, a place where the global radio community can gather. In my capacity as the IARU President, I recommend that the **.radio** Top Level Domain (TLD) proposal of the EBU be approved by ICANN."

EBU Director General Ingrid Deltenre welcomed the IARU's expression of confidence: "The EBU believes its application matches ICANN's exacting criteria and best serves the collective interests of the global radio com-munity. These kinds of comments confirm that belief."

Earlier this month, ICANN issued a progress report on the initial evaluation process for the **.radio** proposal. Applications have now been assigned to the relevant geographic, string similarity and DNS stability evaluation panels. According to the EBU, many people and organizations have expressed a desire for more time to comment publicly. The formal period for <u>public comment</u> has been extended to September 26, 2012 to meet the demand of individuals and organizations. Comments received by September 26 will be forwarded to the <u>evaluation panels</u> to review and consider as part of their evaluations.

The EBU serves 74 Members in 56 countries in and around Europe. It represents its members and promotes the values and distinctiveness of public service media in Europe and around the world. The Eurovision and Euroradio networks deliver news, sports, events and music to EBU members and other media organizations.

It is my understanding that John has sold his equipment and will be taking some time to relax and travel without worry of things at home. John, if you read this I wish you the best in anything that you desire to do.

With that said, there is no replacement for the Eighth Region Digital MBO. All digital traffic for the Eighth Region (Ohio, Michigan and West Virginia) will now go to WB2FTX's MBO in New Jersey. There are at least three Digital Relay Stations now in operation to bring Ohio traffic to Ohio with a fourth soon to follow. If you are interested in Digital Traffic handling using Pactor on HF or you would like to be John's replacement for an 8RN MBO, let me know and I will direct you to those in charge of this facet of the NTS system.

2012 Simulated Emergency Test October 6-7

For those not familiar with the National Simulated Emergency Test event and the National Preparedness Month (September), there is an article on this subject in this month's *QST* by Steve Ewald WV1X. The ARRL Simulated Emergency Test is a nationwide exercise in emergency communications, administered by ARRL Field Organization

Leaders including Emergency Coordinators, District Emergency Coordinators, Section Emergency Coordinators and Net Managers.

Many of leaders across the country may have a hand in planning exercises and/or reviewing the results. Amateur Radio Emergency Service® (ARES®), National Traffic System (NTS), Radio Amateur Civil

Emergency Service (RACES) and other public-service oriented groups can be involved.

The SET weekend gives communicators the opportunity to focus on the emergency communications capability within your community while interacting with NTS nets. Although the main SET weekend this year is October

2-3, local and section-wide exercises may be held throughout the fall season. The ARRL encourages you to consider this year's Simulated Emergency Test and preparations for it as a demonstration of Amateur Radio's readiness and as an active participant in National Preparedness Month.

You can participate in this year's SET even if you are not involved in a planned exercise. Simply generate some radiograms and send them through your local net or directly to the Ohio Single Sideband Net. You can send messages to friend or relatives or you can generate some simple test messages. It is important to start each of your messages with the words "test message" if the text of your message refers to a made-up or practice emergency.

If you don't have anyone to send a radiogram to, your ARRL Ohio cabinet member names and addresses are listed elsewhere on this website. As your Section Traffic Manager I encourage you to participate. This is a good time to see just how well local and state nets can handle a large amount of traffic.

Looking ahead to WRC-15

From an Amateur Radio perspective, the 2012 World Radiocommunication Conference (<u>WRC-12</u>) was very successful. According to IARU Secretary Rod Stafford W6ROD, the IARU Administrative Council will meet in the next 45 days and will address the agenda items for the 2015 World Radiocommunication Conference (<u>WRC-15</u>) with an eye to building the

best strategy to deal with those agenda items in a way that is most favorable to the Amateur Radio Service.

WRC-15 **Agenda Item 1.4** calls on the delegates "to consider possible <u>new allocation to the Amateur Service on a secondary basis with the band 5250-5450 kHz in accordance with Resolution 649 (WRC-12)." According to Stafford, the IARU will be spending a lot of time and effort to garner support and to ensure the passage of this Agenda Item.</u>

Agenda Item 1.1 is "to consider additional spectrum allocations to the mobile service on a primary basis and identification of additional frequency bands for International Mobile Telecommunications (IMT) and related regulatory provisions, to facilitate the development of terrestrial mobile broadband applications, in accordance with Resolution 233 (WRC-12)."

"With seemingly everyone around the world gaining some degree of broadband access, the search for radio spectrum to satisfy the needs for mobile connectivity will become

even more intense as we draw closer to WRC-15, Stafford explained. "National telecommunication authorities around the world and the ITU are in search of spectrum to fill these mobile connectivity requirements. As this agenda item develops, the IARU will be there to maintain the Amateur Radio spectrum."

Other WRC-15 Agenda Items the IARU will be closely monitoring include the following:

Agenda Item 1.6.1: "To consider possible additional primary allocations to the fixed satellite service (Earth-to-space and space-to-Earth) of 250 MHz in the range between 10 GHz and 17 GHz in Region 1."

Agenda Item 1.10: "To consider spectrum requirements and possible additional spectrum allocations for the mobile-satellite service in the Earth-to-space and space-to-Earth directions, including the satellite component for broadband applications, including International Mobile Telecommunications (IMT), within the frequency range from 22 GHz to 26 GHz, in accordance with Resolution 234 (WRC-12)."

Agenda Item 1.18: "To consider a primary allocation to the radiolocation service for automotive applications in the 77.5-78.0 GHz frequency band in accordance with Resolution 654 (WRC-12)."

"A lot of radio amateurs are aware of the increasing use of amateur spectrum by small satellites, mainly by universities,"

Stafford noted. "It is becoming an increasingly difficult situation to accommodate the number of small, non-commercial satellites within the amateur bands. These education-based satellites do not really fit within the definition of the Amateur Radio Service, but have been accommodated there. These small satellites are categorized as nanosatellites (weighing between 1-10 kg) and picosatellites (weighing less than 1 kg). The ITU is trying to deal with this issue in an orderly manner and a 'preliminary' WRC-18 agenda item is to consider whether these satellite operations can be accommodated in an already crowded radio spectrum. As these issues develop, the IARU will keep its Member-Societies, such as the ARRL, aware of developments."

Something we never consider: Letters: Mental Health Risks. Out-take from Sep 18 ARES E-Ltr

I'd like to congratulate you on an excellent Public Service column in July 2012 *QST*. I believe it is very important for those involved or contemplating involvement in emergency communications to understand the risks to their mental health as a result of what they may experience.

Although one may experience a traumatic event that causes nightmares and/or depression during ARES events, it is also possible to trigger PTSD of traumatic events of many years or decades past. My personal experience and one apparently common to many Vietnam veterans, was PTSD triggered by the events of 9/11. After more than thirty years home and with a successful career in telecommunications and RF applications development for State Farm Mutual, PTSD and depression happened to me post 9/11.

Prior to 9/11, I enjoyed the challenge of developing disaster recovery communications procedures for State Farm and being involved with MARS, FEMA, and ARES communications. It took several years of psychiatry and medication post 9/11 to recover. Now, while I will support the local emergency communicators as a technical resource, I can no longer be a communicator or be on-site for training or actual events.

Thank you for addressing the issue of the mental health risks as an ARES volunteer. I wish you better times and relief from PTSD. -- CSM(r) Gazy L. Plubez AB9M, Bloomington, Illinois
