WKRC-TV wishes as many people as possible to send their home weather station data to the **Citizens Weather Observer Program (CWOP)**, care of Ch 12 meteorologist Scott Dimmich <u>scott@local12.com</u>. Queries about CWOP &/or how to configure are also welcome.

"Data from weather stations is shared both with the National Weather Service and media in real-time. WKRC monitors local weather stations constantly during active and severe weather, and data from local weather stations is very important to verifying warnings and giving us confirmation for what weather is occurring. The more weather stations we have online in our area, the better informed meteorologists - and in turn, the community - can be, especially when it counts," Mr Dimmich sent.
