- ** In 1973, Hamvention expanded into a two-day event, and Sunday was added to make it a three-day event the following year (1974).
- *** Hamvention officials agree that 30,000 visitors is critical mass given the current facilities at Hara. Anything over 28,000 pushes it at Hara says Matthews. It pushes our restroom facilities, it pushes our food concessions, it pushes our transportation, and it pushes our human comfort factor, which is important.

**** Putting on Hamvention costs in excess of \$700,000 each year.

Ohio Section ranks high in 2012 SET

It was a pleasant surprise to open my July *QST* and see how well the Ohio Section did during the 2012 Simulated Emergency Test (SET). Ohio ranked third for ARES activity in the Nation, and fourth for Section/Local Nets. The Great Lakes Division may recognize licensed radio amateurs occasionally for exemplary performance as amateurs and citizens by issuing awards (e.g. Wilson, Amateur of the Year). In selecting recipients for the awards the Director may appoint a Committee Chair to manage the selection process or may lead the process him/herself. When a Chair is appointed, he/she will appoint with the concurrence of the Director a three-judge panel to review and recommend recipients for the awards, If possible, one judge will be appointed from each the Kentucky, Michigan and Ohio Sections. The Chair will instruct the judges in the criteria for the awards. The Chair will also arrange to issue call(s) for nominations. The calls may include notices published in Director's e-newsletters to the Division.

Information made available to potential nominators will include the:

- name of, description of and requirements for each of the awards,
- general recommendation for material that would be helpful to support a nomination,
- manner in which nominations are to be submitted.
- name and address of the person to whom nominations must be sent, and
- deadline for receipt of nominations.

Nominations submitted in the designated manner will be reviewed by the Chair to ensure they meet minimum requirements for the respective awards (e.g. age, ARRL membership and number of years as licensed amaeurs). Deadline for nominations is July 10, 2013.Nominations may be submitted by visiting the ARRL Great Lakes Division Website: http://arrl-greatlakes.org/awards/award_nomination_2013.html

Copies of eligible nominations will be provided by the Chair to the Director and to each of the judges to re-view as possible award recipients. The panel of judges will determine which, if any nominee(s) it will recommend to the Director as the recipient(s) of each award. If practical, the panel of judges is encouraged to confer with each other in reaching its decisions regarding award winners. The Director will make the ARRL Conference Bridge teleconference system available to the judges for such conferences.

How's It Working?

It has been nearly a year since H.B. 158 (the Bill) became law in Ohio. Local zoning authorities are now required by both federal and Ohio law to afford reasonable accommodation to requests for approval of amateur radio antennas.

Successful use of the Bill requires understanding on both sides. Hams need to understand what they are, and are not entitled to, while local zoning authorities need to understand their obligations under the Bill.

For hams, it means that they are entitled to reasonable accommodation of zoning requests for amateur radio antennas. It does not, however, eliminate the need to apply for a building permit and a zoning variance if re-quired by local regulations for the desired antenna installation. Other local restrictions, such as setback limits may also apply. Local zoning authorities need to understand their obligation to provide accommodation for amateur radio an-tennas, even if the request exceeds what would otherwise be permitted under local zoning regulations. The

Bill also places the burden on local zoning authorities to show that they have complied with the Bill in the event that an appeal is taken from the denial of a variance request.

The Bill applies to municipal, township and county zoning ordinances. According to Wikipedia, Ohio has nearly 1300 townships, 88 counties and 932 municipalities, each with authority to adopt its own zoning

ordinances. There is no requirement of uniformity for local zoning ordinances, so that each one may have different requirements. Given the potential variance it is difficult to develop "across the board" guidance for hams seeking approval for new antennas.

Based on what we have heard so far it appears that many local zoning authorities have never heard of either PRB-1 or H.B. 158 and have a great deal of trouble understanding why radio amateurs are entitled to relief from local zoning regulations in ways that do not apply to non-amateurs. Thus, successful variance applications will involve educating those authorities, about the new requirements imposed upon them by the Bill.

As we continue to explore ways to help get more hams on the air, we need to hear from you. Let us know, both about the successes and the failures. Every antenna variance application creates precedent for the one to follow - good precedent if it is granted, bad precedent if it's rejected.
