OhKyIn ARS Minutes, January 2, 2014 Meeting

The meeting was called to order by President Gary Coffey KB8MYC at 7:37 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance. One guest, John W9NMT, was present. 26 members responded to the call for self introductions.

Brag Session: Robert AK3Q reported that he had qualified for DXCC. Kitty W8TDA reported (via Gary) that she worked Santa on 20 meters.

The program was presented by Russ WB8ZCC. He had a Power Point explanation, aided by an actual duplexer and a test instrument by which is showed how to tune and detune a duplexer. It was a very interesting program, continued after the end of the Business Meeting.

After a short recess, the Business Meeting reconvened at 8:14 PM.

Two months of Minutes were considered, one by one. It was moved and seconded to approve the November 12, 2013, Minutes as printed. The motion passed by unanimous vote. It was moved and seconded to approve the Minutes of the December 3, 2013, Meeting as printed, corrected for mis-titling in print as November. The motion passed by unanimous vote.

There was no membership number announced. Membership renewals are due. Any member who refers a person to the club during 2014 and the person becomes a member will receive a \$5 discount on 2015 membership.

The Treasurer's Report was distributed. There were unusual expenses in December because of the Christmas Party; the Christmas Party Fund was exhausted. The Report showed \$777.04 in the checking account and \$11,911.89 in the checking account for a total of \$11,911.89 in the bank. It was moved and seconded to approve the Treasurer's Report. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

Technical Committee: The 146.925 repeater was installed at St. Elizabeth Hospital in Northern Kentucky during December. Thanks to Dick WB4SUV for procuring permission for the repeater to be installed, and to Russ WB4ZCC for his hard work to install it. An existing OHKYIN feed line and antenna, previously installed at this location, were used. The repeater is working very well. In addition, 3 CAT repeater controllers are being repaired and will be placed in operation this month. The club will have a portable repeater and handheld HTs for special occasion use. Education Committee: Classes will be held early this year. Classes for the Extra Class license will begin on February 3 at 7 PM. Classes for the General License and the Technician Class Licenses will begin on February 24. Exams will be scheduled.

Fox Hunts: More people are needed to reactivate the monthly fox hunts. Contact Brian K4BRI or Dick WB4SUV for more information. Our regular fox hunters do well in competitions.

Tech Talk: There are 15 or 20 check-ins each week. Others are welcome.

Elmers' Net: There usually about 18 checkins and it seems like usually 1 or 2 are new checkins. Old Business: The Club's Library needs sorting. Ted NC8V and Eric KD8MEM volunteered. New Business: Brunch Bunch will be Saturday at Diane's on Anderson Ferry between Crookshank and Sidney. The North American SSB Contest is this weekend, said to be a good contest. An Audit Committee is needed, with a report due at the March meeting. Volunteers should contact Gary KB8MYC, our President. The Mansfield OH Hamfest will be Feb. 16. There is some interest in starting a revived club Hamfest. The location would have no cost and indoor and outdoor facilities – it could all be indoors. A committee is needed to explore this possibility and make a recommendation. Eric KD8MEM and Ted NC8V volunteered. We were asked if there was sufficient interest in again having a booth at the Dayton HamVention ©. It was informally agreed to spend \$100 and have a 4 space booth again. Gary announced that he had
