There were no Health and Welfare announcements.

Brag Session: Kitty W8TDA reported that she worked the CW SweepStakes and worked 49 of the 50 US States. Earlier she worked many DX stations on CW. Brian, K4BRI, reported on the combined IARU and USA Fox Hunt Contest held in the forests of North Carolina. Margie KJ4ZKC won two Gold Medals. Brian won a Bronze and a Silver Medal. Dick WB4SUV won one Bronze medal. Susie N8CGM told of a singing show and ticket opportunities.

Jerry Shipp W1SCR gave the program – explaining the Amateur Radio Emergency Service, including HF and Digital Nets, and also VHF and UHF nets. The Ohio Association of Radio Emergency Services wants a list of equipment available for emergency use. A 5 minute break was announced at 8:3 PM. The break ended at 8:43 when the President called the meeting back to order. One additional member arrived during the break.

The Minutes of the October meeting were printed in *The Q-Fiver*. It was moved and seconded to approve the Minutes as printed. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

The Club had 113 members before the meeting and 114 by the time the meeting reconvened.

New Business: The Nominating Committee reported its nominations: Gary Coffey KB8MYC for President, Jerry Shipp W1SCR for Vice President, Fred Schneider K9OHE for Secretary, Brian DeYoung K4BRI for Treasurer, and Bryan Hoffman KC8EGV for a 3 year term on the Board of Diretors. There were no nominations from the floor. It was moved and seconded to accept the nominations as presented. The motion passed unanimously. The Election will be held in December.

Next month will be the usual Christmas Party with door prizes, pizza and more.

Brunch Bunch will meet this Saturday at Price Hill Chili.

The SSB Sweep Stakes will be held this Saturday and Sunday at the home and shack of Eric N8YCL, beginning at 4:00 PM on Saturday.

On the Air: Get Ready -- The ARRL Centennial QSO Party Kicked Off January 1!



The ARRL celebrates its centennial in 2014.

As part of the mix of events marking the League's 100th anniversary, the <u>ARRL Centennial QSO Party</u> gets underway at 0001 UTC on January 1. This is a year-long operating event, in which participants can accumulate points & win awards, as well as work new stations & make new friends. During 2014 W1AW will be on the air at least twice from *every* US state and from most US territories, & it will be easy to work all states solely by contacting W1AW portable operations. This will be the first ARRL-sponsored operating event for which every member is worth at least one point. The event is open to all, although only ARRL members and appointees, elected officials, HQ staff, & W1AW are worth points. Working the ARRL's president, for example, earns 300 points!

To qualify for points, all contacts must be two-way (no cross-band or cross-mode contacts), using CW, phone (FM, SSB, AM, digital voice), digital (any digital mode, such as PSK31,

RTTY) on 160, 80, 40, 30, 17, 15, 12, 10, 6, 2 & 1.25 meters, plus 70 centimeters and satellite.

Stations <u>exchange</u> signal report & ARRL abbreviation. Contacts do not have to be contest-style, & providing ARRL organizational information is not required. A centennial database will assign point values to all logs submitted electronically. Those **not** submitting electronically, however, will need to obtain the QSO information during the contact. Since this is not a contest, participants may make contacts in any fashion they prefer.

The Centennial QSO Party is scored by totaling the values of all eligible contacts. There are no multipliers or bonus points. Logs submitted via Logbook of the World (<u>LoTW</u>) will be scored automatically. Sun has 'flipped upside down' magnetically

The sun has "flipped upside down", with its north & south poles reversed to reach the midpoint of Solar Cycle 24, NASA has said. Now the magnetic fields will once again start moving in opposite directions to begin the completion of the 22 year long process which will culminate in the poles switching once again.

"A reversal of the sun's magnetic field is, literally, a bnig event," said NASA's Dr Tony Phillips. "The domain of the sun's magnetic influence (also known as the 'heliosphere') extends billions of kilometers beyond Pluto. Changes to the field's polarity ripple all thje way out to the Voyager probes, on the doorstep of interstellar space."

It began January 1, 2014 and will extend through December 31, 2014? It is the "mother" of all QSO parties. Judging from the first few hours of the New Year, this will be a very successful party, too. So what are the basics of it?

The ARRL Centennial QSO party actually is two distinct-but-related activities. These involve working W1AW from each state (W1AW Worked All States) and a Centennial Points Challenge. The W1AW WAS is possible because throughout 2014, W1AW will be operating portable from each state for considerable periods of time. There, of course, will be W1AW/1 in each of the FCC Area 1 states, W1AW/2 in each of the Area 2 states, etc. through W1AW/0. Most US territories will also operate W1AW portable (e.g. W1AW/KH2 W1AW/KP2, etc.). To get a W1AW WAS, simply work W1AW portable from each of the 50 US states from January 1 through December 31. W1AW will operate portable from each state twice during the year.

The Centennial Points Challenge is equally as simple, but involves QSOing as many ARRL officials and members as possible . . . & club stations for ARRL affiliated clubs. Collect points by contacting every ARRL member from President through individual member. One note of importance: all entries into the Centennial Challenge **must be made via LoTW**. Other awards made be requested
