OHKYIN Amateur Radio Society, Corrected Minutes of May 27, 2014 Board Meeting* The Board of Directors met on Tuesday May 27, 2014, at the St, Bernard City Hall. All Board members were present.

I arrived a few minutes late and the meeting was already in progress. Before I arrived, the Minutes of the last Board meeting had been approved, by motion, second and vote. A Preliminary May 2014 Treasurer's Report was considered and approved.. The Hamfest is September 21. The Hamfest will be on the sign at Aiken High School that day. Janitor service is available – 6 hours at \$35.79 per hour for a total of \$217.74. One advantage would be that everything will be put back in the places. It was moved and second to approve this expense. The motion passed unanimously.

As of this date, we have 109 members.

Technical Committee: 3 of the 4 repeaters are on the air. There was an update on the new location for the 146.925 repeater. Verbal approval of the agreement was obtained. Here's the information from the Ohio BMV website about what is now required:

Owners or lessees of motor vehicles who are residents of Ohio & hold an unrevoked & unexpired official amateur radio station license issued by the Federal Communications Commission may apply for these plates. The official call letters will be the license plate numbers. There are no options.

Registrant Eligibility - Owner must submit a copy of the unrevoked & unexpired official amateur radio license issued by the Federal Communications Commission. (FCC).

Title Requirements - Ohio Certificate of Title issued in the same name as the FCC license, either singly or jointly, or the name on the FCC license is the same name on the lease agreement.

Vehicle Information - These plates may be issued to passenger vehicles, non-commercial trucks, recreational vehicles, house vehicles & non-commercial trailers.

Type of Plates - Plates will be manufactured with the FCC license.

Issuance Information - Amateur Radio plates cannot be issued with system assigned, reserved, or personalized plate formats.

Renewal of plates can be done at your local Deputy Registrar or by mail using their renewal notice. Amateur Radio License Holders must provide a copy of current unexpired & unrevoked official amateur radio license issued by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) at the time of any type renewal transaction.

All plates will be mailed directly to the address on your registration card unless customer requests otherwise. The deputy will issue your registration card, stickers & provide you with a permit which will allow you to operate your vehicle while your plates are being manufactured.

Special license plate applications are available at all Deputy Registrar license agency locations or can be downloaded by clicking HERE.

Cost - These plates cost an additional \$10 annually plus normal registration fees. The fee is determined by Ohio Revised Code section 4503.14.

ARLB014 Changes to Amateur Service Part 97 Rules Go Into Effect July 21 (dated 6.23.2014) The FCC's recently announced revisions to the Part 97 Amateur Radio rules governing exam credit to former licensees, test administration, & emission types will go into effect on Monday, July 21. The new rules were published in *The Federal Register* on June 20.

In a wide-ranging Report and Order (R&O) released June 9, the Commission announced that it would grant examination credit for written elements 3 (General) & 4 (Amateur Extra) to holders of "expired licenses that required passage of those elements." The FCC will require former licensees falling outside the 2-year grace period to pass Element 2 (Technician) in order to be relicensed. The Commission declined to give exam credit to holders of expired Certificates of Successful Completion of Examination (CSCEs) or to extend lifetime validity to CSCEs. The FCC also embraced the use of remote testing methods, allowing volunteer examiners & volunteer examiner coordinators "the option of administering examinations at locations remote from the VEs." The National Conference of Volunteer Examiner Coordinators (NCVEC) in 2002 endorsed experimental use of videoconferencing technology to conduct Amateur Radio testing in remote areas of Alaska. The Commission dropped its earlier proposal to permit 2 VEs to administer exams; the requirement remains at 3 VEs. The Commission did not spell out the "mechan-

ics" of remote testing, however, which it said would "vary from location to location & session to session." VEs administering examinations remotely must grade such examinations "at the earliest practical opportunity," rather than "immediately," as the current rule for conventional exam sessions requires.

The FCC also adopted an ARRL proposal to authorize certain Time Division Multiple Access (TDMA) emissions in the Amateur Service. The Wireless Telecommunications Bureau in 2013 granted an ARRL request for a temporary blanket waiver to permit radio amateurs to transmit emissions with designators FXD, FXE, & F7E, pending resolution of the rulemaking petition. That waiver becomes permanent on July 21.

The Commission also made "certain minor, non-substantive amendments" & corrections to the Amateur Service rules.
