## A Truly Historic Coincidence

Sometimes you stumble across things that prove that truth really is stranger than fiction. Such was the case for me recently. To tell this story though, I need to start back in the spring of this year and tell you a bit about my home. The house my wife and I live in is nearly identical to our next door neighbor's house. The reason for this is because the two houses were built in 1961 by my neighbor's relative, who was the original owner of my house. This past spring, I decided to put some ropes up in my trees before the leaves came out and it happened that one day while I was working on this, one of my neighbor's family members was doing some yard work for her and stopped to talk to me (admittedly it does look strange to be throwing ropes into trees and draws a bit of attention). More recently, I had reason to check my property records on the county auditor's website and in the course of poking around there, it occurred to me that perhaps I could find the name of my home's original owner and see if I could figure out if he was still around somewhere and licensed. After a little digging on the website, I did find the name of both he and his wife: Earl & Vera Schweikhart.

An FCC ULS search led me to believe that they had both been licensed at some point but no longer were. Then a thought hit me: I wonder if they were part of OH-KY-IN? How could I figure that out? Maybe I could e-mail some of the members that have been around a while and have them check old directories? Maybe I could search through old Q-Fivers? Hmmm...

After poking around the OH-KY-IN website for a bit though, I made a surprising discovery. Check this out:
