

Health and Welfare: Rocky KE8DZS reported Dennis KD8ILY is in the hospital.

Brag Sessions:

- Andrew K8AKC contacted Argentina on 10m this afternoon.
- Ted NC8V bought his first new non-HT radio, an ICOM IC-7610.

Prior Meeting Minutes: George N3VQW moved and Andrew K8AKC seconded accepting the last meeting minutes as published in the Q-Fiver. Motion passed.

Membership: Ryan AC8UJ told us Nathan KA3MTT reported we are up to 164 members!

Silent Keys: Not present, none reported.

Treasurer: Brian K4BRI submitted his report for audit. He also informed us that the club's credit card was hacked, but it was caught and we were reimbursed; this is reflected in the report that was submitted for audit.

Tech Operations: Gary KB8MYC reported that Mobilcomm climbed the WLWT tower to check the 67 repeater's feedline and replace the antenna if necessary. The feedline was swept, and it checked out a-okay. The antenna was checked, and it was fine. However, there was a damaged or poorly installed connector on the phasing harness. Thankfully Leo with WLWT had a connector on hand for us and

Mobilcomm replaced ours. The SWR of the antenna and 750' of feedline looks almost perfect. Gary KB8MYC has been listening and it sounds good so far. We will have to replace the antenna mount at some point as it is about 35 years old and showing its age. Now that the time and money has been invested in the 67 repeater, please use it! Special thanks to Bruce N8BV for babysitting the repairs today and Leo with WLWT for having a connector we could use on hand.

Classes/Exams: Mike KD8ZLB reported that there is lots of interest in classes. He is waiting to hear back from Shannon at the Red Cross. He will look into starting classes in January as that will give enough lead time for advertising.

Fox Hunts and ARDF: Bob WA6EZV reported there are no practice events at the moment. Nationals are 10/13 - 10/17 in North Carolina. Bob WA6EZV, Matthew AA9YH and Mike Minium are heading out to compete.
