The rules:

- Each club member may submit up to three entries.
- Any artwork used in your design must be freely usable by the club and evidence supporting this must be included with your submission (e.g. a statement that you created the artwork, a link to the artwork showing a permissive license, etc.). Watermarked images/artwork must not be used.
- Any design including images of people must include permission from them to use their likeness.
- Ryan AC8UJ reserves the right to disqualify any design for any reason.
- By submitting a design, you agree that OH-KY-IN may use it indefinitely without compensation to you.

All accepted designs will be published without attribution in the October Q-Fiver along with instructions on how to vote for your favorite. The winning design, along with attribution for all designs, will appear in the November Q-Fiver.

Macedonia as well as Bosnia and Herzegovina declared their independence in April 1992.

The two remaining republics declared the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (FRY) on April 27 1992.

In 2003 the FRY was re-named as a state Union of Serbia and Montenegro.

This ended in 2003 following Montenegro's formal declaration of Independence on 3 June 2006 and Serbia's on June 5th, 2006. — Good Dx de WA6EZV


