


QSL Card Design Entries

Current QSL Card







Split the Pot: \$50.00 The winner will receive \$25.00. The winner this month is KD8TMO


Tom W8WTD made a motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Bruce N8BV. The meeting was adjourned at 9:00PM ET.
