We aim for a more experimental approach with Winter Field Day

(as compared to the summer ARRL Field Day event). Have a radio you want help with? Bring it! Want to try a new antenna? Let's try it!

Much will remain the same as previous years, but we are making a few changes this time around. First, we plan on handling the food a bit different this year. Although we greatly enjoyed Chef John's chili in the past, the impact of unpredictable weather for this event makes it very hard to estimate expected turnout far enough in advance to purchase and prepare the right quantity. To simplify things, we'll be offering a couple of different options this year instead. It also provides some meteorological information about severe weather such as hurricanes, tornadoes, hail, floods, damaging wind, and winter weather."


